Heard from Denis Moore:



Daytime on Sept. 8th [ed note: the photo has been lightened!]



Sept. 8th: Nighttime at Denis' home

8 Sep: I just took the attached pictures [above]. The smoke is so thick that it is like nighttime. The fire is about 10 miles east of here and there is going to be an east wind today. There is also a new fire that has 101 closed between Hwy 162 (Covelo Road) and Willits. You need to look at the photos on a computer not cell phone. In one you can see the tractor and trailer but if I did not know what I was looking at I would not know what it was. It is really that dark out.

Got to go I am cleaning up flammable material, leaves and grass around buildings. In the dark!

27 Sep: "Things are ok here but things sort of lit up today with the wind. Here is a link to a map that is continuously updated with satellite heat signature from the fires <u>https://maps.nwcg.gov/sa/#/%3F/%3F/</u>40.1004/-123.2111/10 [Denis lives on East Rd in Covelo]

.... There was hardly any red on it last night and now there are some seriously hot fires going. During church this morning several cell phones went off with the emergency alert signal notifying us that several areas North of here were being evacuated. One of the people at church lives in one of the areas that was being evacuated. He plans to stay there and protect his place if the fire gets close.

The smoke has not been too bad for the last few days. It was starting to bother me with an annoying cough. I am leaving two doors open tonight to cool off the house. Hope I do not wake up to a house full of smoke in the morning.

I miss the square dancing and the fellowship. Wish things would get back to normal.

Got to go.

2 Oct: "We have had lots of smoke but the fire definitely is calming down. Air quality for the last few days has been very bad. Three days ago the entire community of Ruth burned. Some friends of mine lost everything. They evacuated to the Ruth airport because it was clear of brush and trees and would not burn. Around 11pm the first day, there was a knock on their window of their camper and it was the owner of the Ruth Lodge. He invited everyone that was at the airport to come to the Lodge and gave them beds and dinner. All I can say is WOW!!! It almost brings tears to my eyes to hear of such kindness.

I went to dinner last night at a friends place and when I got home around 9pm there was a huge cow standing on my lawn eating the grass. I had watered the lawn in the morning so each step the cow took she sank about 5 or 6 inches into the wet ground. Plus she gave me a big pile of cow p--p next to my sidewalk. One of the joys of living in the country. I chased the cow out of my yard and back on to the road and it headed home. A neighbors fence had a problem and a bunch of cattle escaped. A pickup truck hit a calf and killed it. I walked down the road and talked to a tribal policeman about what was going on. He was waiting for the Highway Patrol to show up and I understand that they never came due to 7 active accidents on highway 101 last night.

Got to go."

5 Oct: "So far all is well. Saturday we could see flames at the top of the hills North of the Valley but that is about 8 miles from here. As long as the wind is calm we should be fine. We do have rain in the forecast for Saturday. We could use about 2 inches of it."
